Bragg Creek, AB – The Trans Canada Trail is another step closer to completion thanks to the Greater Bragg Creek Trails Association (GBCTA). Due to the association’s efforts the first section of the Bragg Creek Trans Canada Trail was built this fall and a fundraising campaign has been launched to finish the trail by 2017.

The Bragg Creek Trans Canada Trail Project is a 7.5 km trail that will fill an important gap in the Trans Canada Trail network. Once complete, the trail will connect the Hamlet of Bragg Creek with the West Bragg Creek trail head, providing year-round access to hikers, bikers, and trail lovers of all types to the Kananaskis trails as part of the Trans Canada Trail.

“This trail is important because it connects Calgary, Bragg Creek, Canmore and Banff; making our neighbouring communities part of the Trans Canada Trail legacy,” says GBCTA spokesman Robert Sadee.

“We’re thrilled to have finished the first section of the trail. **But to complete the final 5 km of trail, we’re asking trail supporters to help us reach our \$150,000 fundraising goal by June 1.** If we can get the funds by next June we have a good chance of completing the trail link next summer.”

“Building a national trail that will be a legacy for generations to come and serve as a natural stage for Canada 150 celebrations in 2017 requires the tireless dedication of many groups and individuals,” says Trans Canada Trail President & CEO Deborah Apps. “We are grateful to the GBCTA for their unwavering commitment in developing a world-class recreation destination, and contributing to this magnificent gift from Canadians, to Canadians.”

“From emerging sports like fat biking to tried and true sports like cross-country skiing, West Bragg Creek trails appeal to all skill levels and abilities year-round. These trails are a welcome addition to the already large and growing inventory of outdoor recreational

opportunities across the province that Albertans can be proud of,” says Cam Westhead, MLA for Banff-Cochrane.

The association has already raised more than \$600,000 in support of the project which is budgeted at \$1.2 million. Organizers are actively sourcing grants and corporate support but need the support of individuals, families, and organizations to reach their goal and ensure the trail is built in time for the 2017 goal to finish the Trans Canada Trail.

“This is a great opportunity for individuals to be part of a legacy project and to make the Bragg Creek Trans Canada Trail connection a reality,” says Sadee. “Trail lovers can donate in their own name, as a group, or to recognize a loved one. **Donations of \$250 or more will be permanently recognized along the trail.** A gift in someone’s name makes a great gift, for Christmas or for any other celebration.”
